JUMPING IN

On May 27th, the students of the San Diego Summer Project gathered behind the Santa Clara recreation center with no knowledge of what coming to San Diego would look like. After getting settled in their housing, playing a few icebreakers, and meeting the staff, the students learned about the “Jumping In” theme.

This is the week the students were assigned to a DNA group of three to four people. DNA stands for divine truth, nurturing community, and apostolic mission. In their DNA groups, students study God’s word (divine truth), admit spiritual weakness and call out spiritual strengths (nurturing community), and evangelize on the beach and the local college campuses (apostolic mission). A DNA group is where students are challenged to share their stories and confess their past. The students were also assigned to a ministry team during this week.



One student leader challenged their small group to jump in the ocean as a symbol of jumping into what God was calling them to do this summer. Many students took the challenge and along with jumping in the ocean, they immediately begin jumping into community.
